VISITS TO RIKERS ISLAND

Visitor journey map

PREPARATION

- Review online visits schedule
- Review dress code
- Determine who will go (max 3 visitors)
- Bring identification and two quarters for lockers

TRANSPORTATION

- Connection to the Q100 bus
- Travel time to and from Rikers

WELCOME AND REGISTRATION

- Arrive to Central Visit building
- Place belongings in locker
- Leave strollers behind at home or near lockers (strollers are not allowed on visiting floor)

SEARCH AND SECURITY

- Pass clear metal detector (may include pat search over clothing) at first security check
- Visitors are lined up when leaving Central Visits for another security check and opportunity to dispose of an contraband in a red amnesty box
- A second security scan will take place at the jail facility

VISIT DETAINED PERSON

- Wait in final waiting room
- Take shuttle to and from the jail facility to Central Visit Center (leaves every 20-30 minutes)
- Visit lasts up to one hour



Focus on 4 of the 10 principles that are most relevant to visits:

- 1. Strengthen Community and Family
- 2. Ease and Broaden Access to Resources
- 3. Promote Safety and Security
- 4. Foster Safe and Positive Social Interaction





Principle: Strengthen Community and Family

- Design strategy: Provide normative furniture and materials.
- DOC initiative (underway): Renovation of Central Visits location - flooring, seating, paint





Principle: Ease and Broaden Access to Resources

- Design strategy: Provide access and information to support services.
- DOC initiative: Presence of service providers in Central Visits to share information with visitors about DOC programming and resources (complete).





Principle: Promote Safety and Security

- Design strategy: Create clear lines of sight.
- DOC initiative: Increased camera coverage in visit areas (under consideration).





Principle: Foster Safe and Positive Social Interaction

- Design strategy: Maximize privacy for visitors and people who are incarcerated when they are meeting.
- DOC initiative: Offer customer service training to all visit staff (under consideration).

- Following this meeting, the group will complete a survey to continue this exercise for the other six design principles.
