In Queens, the City would demolish the existing Queens Detention Facility at 82nd avenue and replace it with a modern facility. The new jail would have housing units for detainees, programming and recreational space, and a new above-ground public parking facility. On the ground floor there would be publicly-accessible community space.

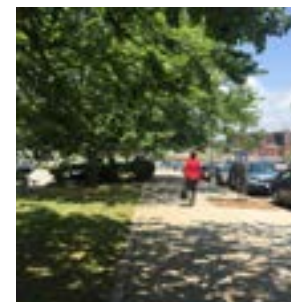


LOCATION IN THE QUEENS CIVIC CAMPUS
